Reports of the subgroup discussions

### Women

1. In all a big thanks to the friends of GRACE in Germany. Through their help, the women of Chipunga were helped greatly!
2. In future, a loan scheme for starting small businesses for women would allow income for women.
3. For the children a nursing school (kindergarten)
4. To organise an under five clinic once a month at Chipunga
5. Support in getting maize for the critical months January to April
6. Receiving training in health issues (by Ruth?)
7. Improvement of the water supply for the compound
8. For employees living outside the compound: no iron sheets for roofing material, thus leaking of roof during the rains

## Young Men

1. In regards to football:
  - a. Thanks to GRACE; we are the only team in the region who play in a nice tricot!
  - b. Lack of football boots
  - c. Lack of footballs – most others are already worn out
  - d. Lack of transportation to the football matches in the region
2. Health
  - a. Thanks to GRACE; the hospital bills are paid by GRACE
  - b. Continuous re-stocking of the first aid box
  - c. On weekends there is no transport to Mzuzu
3. Water supply in the compound: there is a real problem
4. Education
  - a. Thanks to GRACE for the support for secondary school fees
  - b. The fees have significantly increased, the budget for support is limited
  - c. No further support programme for students who have finished with form 4 – suggestions to support post school students also in attending courses
  - d. School fees to be paid by one person; it happens that the school fees are given out by GRACE through the MD but they don't reach the school

## Men

1. Education
  - a. We are thankful for the support of GRACE
  - b. The support should be extended to courses after the secondary school as well
  - c. School fees have about doubled: if possible the budget should be increased
2. Health
  - a. Thanks to GRACE for paying the hospital bills
  - b. A training for the four volunteers (2 women; 2 men) is badly needed
3. Livelihoods
  - a. The blankets are not lasting for long. The quality is poor and the size should be bigger
  - b. Mattresses should be included in the programme apart from the blankets
  - c. Water supply: a water pump is needed

- d. Improvement of the houses: apart from the contribution of GRACE, Chipunga Farm should pay for the labour. This applies for the well and for the floors of the houses
- e. Goat programme: if no goats can be found, the programme should supply the employees with cows

Lengthy and heated discussions arose on this issue. Clarification for Willi assisted in the identification process. Main criteria for the delegates were

1. Good manners and behaviour in order to represent Chipunga area well
