Dear Sir,

Thank you very much for your letter dated 27th Feb. 2006 in which you have responded to our report on our annual meeting.

On behalf of the C.D.C. I would like to thank you for accepting all our requests. Your cooperation is very much appreciated. Responding to your complaint about the development of houses and water well, let me let you know that people are now ready to do the work. As I am writing this letter, we have already started gathering sand from the river, and curvults are at the well waiting for the rainy season to go away.

May I again ~~thank~~ thank you for the fertilizer we got, which has made some of us to plant more maize than before. May I now respond to the points arose in our annual meeting.

Scholl Fees. We have 16 pupils this year in first term. A sum of MK66,400-00 has been spent. The second term will

be higher because there will be examination fees to those who will write government examinations. Take note that our schools in Malawi have 3 terms per year.

Courses after secondary level. Our boys have not yet found the type of courses to go for, so they say they will do so next academic year.

Blankets and Mattresses: We went to check on prices on these items and we want to give you our proposal.
Mattress size $\frac{3}{4} \times 4$ " price MK 7,000.00 x 50
Blankets size double price MK 1,500.00 x 50

Nursary school. We have not yet found someone to run the school.

Loan scheme for small business for women
Women formed the committee to run this scheme and three groups have also been formed which will be supervised by the women main committee, but however C.D.C. will be responsible for the women's committee and groups.
Attached is our proposal on the loan scheme.

Under 5 clinic: This is not very necessary to us now since the government has organized this at Chipungu former M.Y.P. base. The work is in progress they will provide drug box which will be run by the Health Surveyor who ~~to~~ stays in our ~~compound~~ compound.

Maize storage of need: We have not yet come up with any proposal on this we shall do it later as we go on

Fertilizer Sacco: We were given money to buy Copun fertilizer which was reduced by our government. The amount of this loan was MK 159,600.00, this has been paid in full. We had another fertilizer loan amounting to MK 640,000.00 of which we agreed to contribute 50%, which came to MK 320,000.00. As at now we have contributed MK 65,200.00 we have a balance of MK 254,800.00.

Something on school fees: We have abandoned 2 boys from getting fees, these are
Lameck Mseteka; Failed examination
Faniel Banda; Embezzled money

throw cheating by bringing false receipts
We will continue checking such
malpractices on our boys and girls
including parents.

Goats: We have now received 6 goats
one male and five (5) females. These
goats have been distributed to 5 people
who will in turn distribute the young
one to other people. The system will go
on until everyone of us gets a goat.

May I promise to give you more
and more reports on everything happeni-
ng here. May God bless you all
members and donors of Esrae
charity.
